



## Water Restrictions

Water restrictions are necessary from time to time and enforceable through a bylaw. It is important that you cooperate with these restrictions. Water restrictions are implemented when essential to help ensure that residents continue to have a high-quality water supply for residential consumption and fire protection.

### Water Restrictions (Stage I)

**In addition to the general conservation of water, Stage I Water Restriction includes:**

Watering (irrigation) of lawns and domestic gardens is permitted only once per week between 4:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m., and 7:00 p.m. and 10:00 p.m., and to a maximum depth of one inch of water per week;

The following activities are **NOT** permitted:

- Filling swimming pools;
- Washing exterior building surfaces except by hand using a pail; or
- Washing down driveways, patios or other hard landscape surfaces.

During Stage 1 Restrictions you can still:

- Irrigate newly seeded or sodded lawns planted no more than three weeks before and for no more than three weeks following the water restriction imposition date;
- Irrigate new trees and shrubs (no more than six) during planting and for the following 24 hours;
- Use of drip irrigation or hand water domestic gardens at any time.

### Water Restrictions (Stage II)

**Stage II Water Restriction includes activities that are NOT permitted:**

- Irrigation of lawns and gardens (you can only hand water);
- Topping up or adding any water to a swimming pool;
- Washing exterior surfaces of buildings;
- Washing driveways, patios or other hard landscape surfaces.
